These behavior helplines may provide answers to your questions about your pet's problem behavior:

- **University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine Behavior Clinic**
215-898-3347
If the clinic is not open at the time of your call, their recorded message will give you their call-in hours for the week.
- **Tufts Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine Behavior Clinic (Massachusetts)**
PETFAX is a remote consulting service for the Tufts Animal Behavior Clinic. Consultation is done by mail, e-mail or fax. You will be charged a fee. For more information, go to www.tufts.edu/vet/petfax.
- **Denver Dumb Friends League**
At www.ddfl.org, click on the Education menu and then "Behavior Helpline." You'll be directed to the Animal Behavior Helpline Online Counsel Request Form, which you can use to reach a trained behavior counselor at the Dumb Friends League. The counselor will contact you by phone or e-mail (whichever you choose) to help solve the behavior problem you're experiencing. Expect a response within two to four days. This service is free.
